

TAAA Time Keeper Position

Position

Timekeepers are very important and are an integral part of the Officiating team. A Timekeeper is the off-ice official who is responsible for the control of the time clock and for the proper completion of the official game sheet.

Requirements

- Minimum age requirement is 14 Prior to December 31 of Season Year
- Strong attention to detail
- Must have a good understanding of the game of hockey
- Great communication skills is required

Responsibilities of the Timekeeper:

- Work independently with electronic Game IPad and Score clock
- Test the time clock prior to the warm ups
- Ensure that the Referee is aware if the length of each game and advise of any curfew.
- Input your timekeeper information into the Ipad
- Accurately run the Score Clock.
- Record all penalties/goals and assists accurately on the game lpad as directed by the Referee. IF UNSURE ASK THE REFEREE.
- Be familiar with the Referee Signals as well as OMHA Penalties codes. (A reference manual will be in the booth or supplied to you.)
- Assist younger players opening the penalty box door if required. Assistance should be offered to both teams
- At the end of the game ensure that the Referees sign the Ipad

Guidelines:

- Arrive a minimum of 15 minutes prior to your assigned game time
- Ensure that you have a minimum of 2 pucks for each game
- Ask Referees for Game Ipad
- No walking across the ice surface
- <u>Absolutely NO friends/visitors</u> near the timekeeping booth during a game. Focus on the game being played is paramount
- Any food or drink must be in a non spill able container
- Absolutely no cellphone usage is permitted inside the timekeeping booth for calls, Texts, streaming unless from a convenor for your current game
- Do not talk to the players on the ice and limit interaction with players in the penalty box



Important Note:

- If a timekeeper fails to perform their responsibilities or follow the rules listed above in a professional manner they will be dismissed from their remaining assigned game.
- If you are sick and unable to make an assigned game, please notify our current Time keeper coordinator with as much notice as possible.
- All Payments will be made via e-transfer.
- Payments for the previous month will be made no later than 15 days from the end of the previous month i.e.: October will be paid no later than Nov 15.
